

Sewing

With the help of sewing supports (or bands) the sections are joined with thread. A traditional way of binding is the use of rope as a sewing support. This can be a series of single ropes but also double supports are used often in older bindings. Leather is also used as sewing supports (again single or double). Lots of antique books are sewn on parchiment strips, and in modern bindings like our case binding on cloth strips or bill tape. On the image below you can see a simple self-made sewing frame on which a bookblock is sewn with alum tanned leather double sewing supports.



We assume that we are not in the possession of a sewing frame. However, it is worth the trouble to make one on yourself. An internet query with the word "sewing frame" generates many pictures that inspire. If this is not a possibility then you can try to find a sewing frame in the second hand circuit. Either way: a sewing frame eases the work a lot.
